Dear Noah:

I am excited to inform you that Mr. Hess, the Libertarian candidate for Governor has agreed to the series of 10 statewide campaigns that Munsil campaign had previously proposed to your campaign. Unfortunately, I have not yet heard an answer from your campaign regarding those dates.

In particular, October 12th must be left clear on Mr. Munsil's schedule because one of his children has a birthday on that day. I am sure you and Ms. Napolitano understand how important the birthday of a child is in the life of a family.

I have attached the email confirmation I received from Mr. Hess today. Since you have repeatedly said that you want to debate with Mr. Hess and that you want a truly statewide debate, I am left to assume that these dates will meet with your approval.

I was disappointed by your campaign's apparent attempt to keep voters in the dark about Ms. Napolitano's record by proposing a debate schedule that concludes a full 3 ½ weeks before Election Day.

Please let me know at your convenience when we can meet to discuss these details. Also, since Mr. Hess will be an integral part of all 10 debates, I suggest he be included in any substantive conversations about the scheduling of these 10 debates.

Mr. Hess wrote on 9/22:

Hello Mr. Sproul;

I am greatly appreciative of your and Mr. Munsil's invitation to participate in truly statewide debate forums to give people in every part of Arizona the opportunity to scrutinize all of their choices for this very important office up close and personal.

As you may know, the Governor has extended a similar invitation for only three televised venues. I did accept her invitation but made it very clear that I was not interested in limiting our exposure to just a nominal tour.

My concern is that the last of the three debates proposed by the Governor is on October 15th and that is in my opinion an unreasonably long period of time before the November 7th election. A lot can and probably will occur in the month before the election and I believe that the dates you have forwarded will better serve the interests of Arizona.

We have checked all of the proposed dates you have forwarded, and I am or will make myself available for all of them. Please forward specifics as to exact locations and times. At the same time, I am also amenable to changing the October 12th date to either of the proposed alternate dates so as to accommodate Mr. Munsil's family priorities. Family is my own first priority and I understand completely.

Thank you for extending your invitation. I look forward to dissecting the issues and our respective solutions to the woes that face Arizona with all of the candidates--so tell Len to bring his "A" game. :-) (I told Janet to do the same)
